The sound waves bang into structures and cause them to vibrate giving rise to noise. In the process, they get damaged. In younger people, deafness can be caused by too loud noise or from prolonged exposure to loud noise produced by too much amplification a discotheque or by machines in a factory. The noise depends on the energy, the sound waves carry. Decibel scale is used to the measure loudness of the sound.
