- An experiment in 'responsible tourism', 'Lullaby @ Varkala' a project launched two years ago, envisages active participation by foreign tourists to help transform the lives of the 3,200 odd children under the 150 odd Childcare centres—called Anganwadis—by teaching them English and Maths, in addition to providing them daily meals, uniforms, toys and books.

“We want to disprove the notion that tourism is an elitist activity which does not benefit the local community. These are the only Anganwadis in the state equipped with computers and where all kids wear uniforms,” says K.C. Chandrahasan of Kerala Travels. Over Rs. 70 lakh has been spent on the project so far. Every participating tourist spends \$ 20 (Rs. 800) a day. Over 600 tourists have attended the programme so far.

The ones that did, had a substantially higher milk production. According to the researchers, cows that were treated more personally were happier and more relaxed. This treatment reduces the level of stress and production of cortisol, both of which can impair milk production.

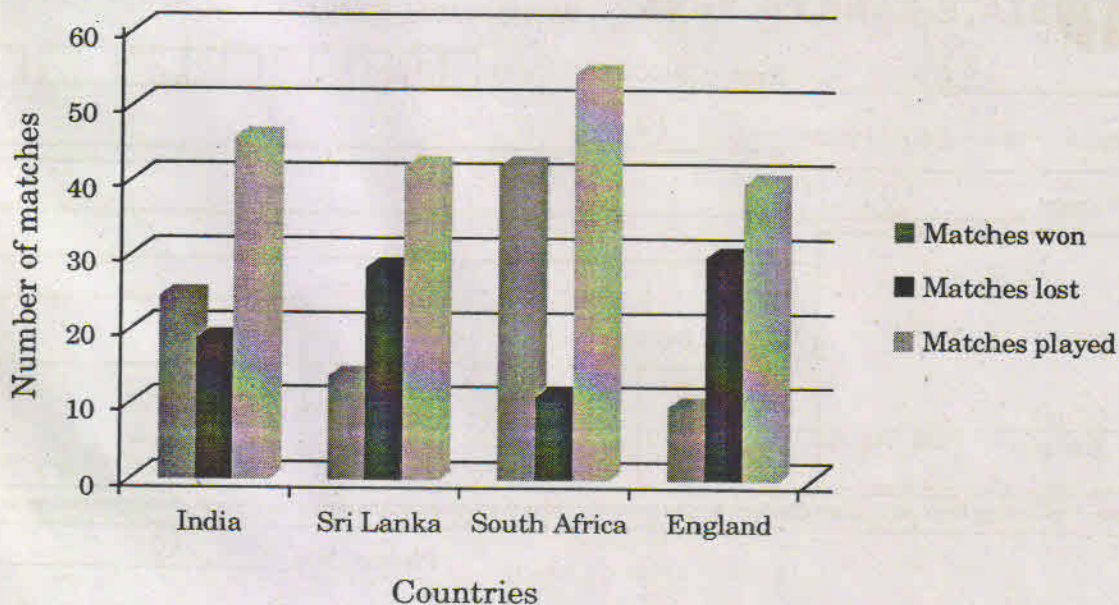
