Q2. Read the given passage carefully and answer the questions:-

- 1). The Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) is the space agency of the Government of Republic of India headquartered in the city of Bengluru. Its vision is to harness the space technology for national development, while pursuing space research and planetary exploration.
- 2). Formed in 1969, ISRO superseded the erstwhile Indian National committee for Space Research (INCOSPAR) established in 1962 by the efforts of Prime Minister Jawaharlal. These rockets have launched numerous communication and observation satellites. Satellite navigation system like GAGAN and IRNSS

has been deployed. In January 2014, ISRO successfully used an indigenous cryogenic engine in GSLV-D5 launch of GSAT-14.

- 3). ISRO built India's first satellite, Aryabhata, which was launched by Soviet Union on 19 April 1975. It was named after mathematician Aryabhata. In 1980 Rohini was to become the first satellite to be placed in orbit by an Indian-made launch vehicle, SLV-3. ISRO subsequently developed two other rockets: the Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV) for launching satellites into Polar orbits and Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle (GSLV) for placing satellites.
- 4). ISRO sent one lunar orbiter; Chandrayaan-1, on 22 October 2008 and one Mars orbiter, which successfully entered Mars orbit on 24 September 2014, making India the first nation to succeed in its first attempt. Future plans include human spaceflight, further lunar exploration, interplanetary probes, and a solar spacecraft mission. On 18 June 2016 ISRO set a record with a launch of 20 satellites in a single payload, one being a satellite from Google. On 15 February 2017 ISRO launched 104 satellites in a single rocket (PSLV-C37) and created a world record. Nehru and his close aide and scientist Vikram Sarabhai with the establishment of ISRO thus institutionalized space activities in India. It is managed by the Department of Space, which reports to the Prime Minister of The Republic of India.
