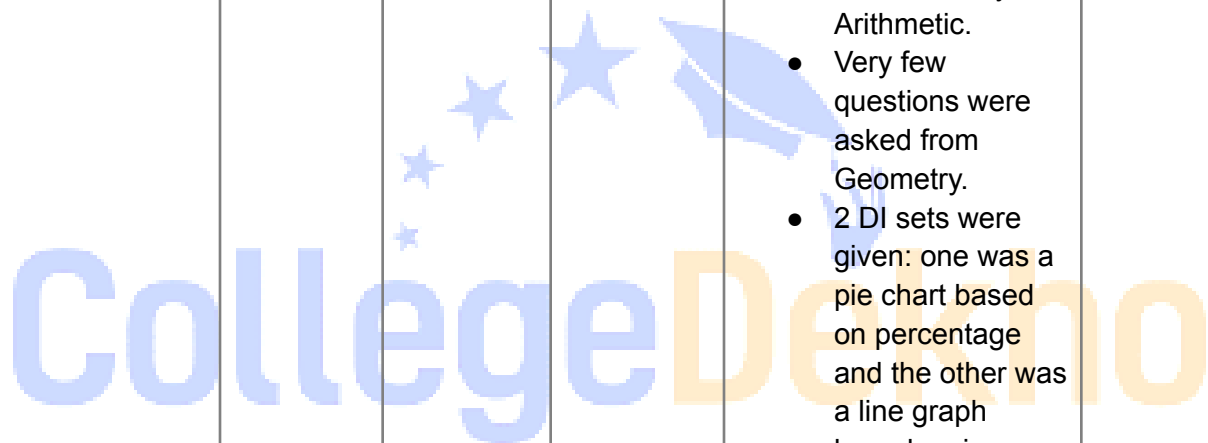

The students' reactions for both slots of the MAH MBA CET 2025 exam conducted on April 1 and 2, 2025, have been provided below.

<p>Day 1, Shift 1</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Shift 1 was quite lengthy. The exam had a sectional test format with a few surprises across the sections. ● The difficulty level of the MAH MBA CET 2025 Slot 1 was higher than the Slot 1 exam of MAH CET 2024. ● Many mini RCs were found in the Verbal Ability section with 1-2 questions. ● Vocabulary and spelling-based questions dominated the Verbal Ability section. ● Quant was very lengthy and highly calculation-intensive. Maximum questions were asked from Geometry & Mensuration (5-6 questions from each). ● Reasoning had 3 puzzles, and most of them were miscellaneous questions. ● In Abstract Reasoning, the maximum questions were asked from figure counting. ● A significant number of puzzles were found. Also, puzzles were given in many questions which were time-consuming. ● Not many questions were asked from Critical Reasoning. Only 1-2 statement-based questions were found similar to Syllogisms. ● Maximum questions were asked from Directions, Blood Relations, Probability.
<p>Day 1, Shift 2</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The overall difficulty level was high. Reasoning was the most difficult section. ● Questions were copied from CAT & XAT. ● Questions were time-consuming and lengthy. ● Abstract Reasoning was on the easier side. Most of the questions were asked from water image, mirror image, counting of figures, odd one out, and completing the series. 20 genuine attempts were possible within 15 minutes. ● Quant was extremely lengthy and calculation-intensive. Questions were asked from Arithmetic, Geometry, Modern Math, and Algebra. ● A lot of questions were asked about Mixture & Alligation. ● In the Reasoning section, 20-25 questions were on Quant only. ● In English, there were long RCs and vocabulary-based questions. ● Not many questions were asked from Critical Reasoning.

<p>Day 2, Shift 1</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The overall difficulty level ranged from easy to moderate. ● The paper was section-wise. ● In Quant, questions were asked from Arithmetic, Data Interpretation, Data Sufficiency, Geometry, Mensuration, Modern Math, and Numbers. Quant was more calculation-intensive. ● Only a few questions were asked on number systems and algebra. ● Approximation methods could be employed to solve certain problems effectively without calculations. ● Unlike Slot 2, there were no questions of CAT or XAT level. ● Puzzles were doable, and the number of questions per set is also less. ● Questions on Profit & Loss, Percentage, Ratio, Pipes & Cisterns were easy. ● In VARC, there were 2-3 RCs and Grammar-based questions, such as sentence correction, tenses, and subject-verb agreement. Grammar-based questions were more prevalent than Vocabulary-based questions. Questions on Synonyms and Antonyms were less frequent. ● There were also questions based on Error identification and sentence structure. ● In LR, the maximum questions were asked on Directions and Seating Arrangement. ● In AR, questions were based on finding the next figure, odd one out, embedded figure, etc.
<p>Day 2, Shift 2</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The overall difficulty level of the paper was low to moderate. It was easier than Slot 1. ● Abstract Reasoning was the easiest section. ● Puzzles were too lengthy. The sets were more, and the number of questions was fewer. ● A question was found on scientific names. ● The maximum questions were asked from Critical Reasoning (Assumptions, Cause & Effect). Around 10-12 questions were found. ● 4-5 Parajumbles were asked which were time-consuming. ● The LR and RC sections were lengthy. ● LR contained 10–12 critical reasoning questions, and some lengthy, puzzle-based questions. ● Syllogisms and Abstract questions were also found. ● Quant was moderate and arithmetic-intensive, and questions on Time-Speed-Distance and Time & Work were found. ● In the VA section, there were 4–5 parajumble questions and questions on vocabulary, grammar, and reading comprehension.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A lot of questions were asked about Vocabulary. RC was lengthier compared to the other parts of this section.
Day 3, Shift 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The overall difficulty level of the paper was low to moderate. • 1-2 questions were asked about Syllogisms. • 4-5 questions were asked from Directions, Blood Relations, Venn Diagrams, and Cubes. • 2-3 questions were asked from Puzzles/ Arrangement. • A total of 20-25 questions were asked from Quant. Quant questions were also found in the LR section. • 4 RCs, 8-10 Vocabulary-based questions, and 6-8 Grammar-based questions were found. • Abstract Reasoning was easy. • 2-3 conclusion-based questions were found in Critical Reasoning.
Day 3, Shift 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The overall difficulty level of the paper was low to moderate. • No questions were found on Data Interpretation. • 5 to 6 puzzles were given in LR. They were moderate in terms of difficulty level. Singlets were easy. • AR was moderate. • Questions were asked from Mensuration, Geometry, and Numbers. • Quant was easy to medium but calculative. • 1 question was found on the Calendar. • A lot of questions were asked from Time, Speed & Distance, Ages, Partnership, and Algebra. • Verbal was easy. In English, there were RC and Vocabulary-based questions. Spelling mistakes and grammatical error-based questions were found. • Parajumbles and main idea-based questions were also asked. • RCs were on Economics, World Population, Air India, Penguins, and Tuwan.
