

MAH MBA CET Exam Analysis 2024

The MAH MBA CET 2024 exam analysis has been updated here for all days.

Overall Exam Analysis for March 9, 2024 (Shift 1)

- The overall difficulty level of the paper ranged from easy to moderate.
- The question paper was completely sectional-type, which implies, that the number of questions in each section was as follows:

- The test-takers had the privilege to jump between the sections. There was no sectional time-limit in the exam.
- Only 2 sets were there in the DI section: 1 from Pie-Chart (angle-based) and 1 from Bar-Graph. Both sets were not layered and hence they were easy to read. However, both of them was extremely calculative.
- The LR section was quite easy. Only 3 puzzles were there in the Shift 1 question paper. Puzzles were from Blood Relations with Profession, Scheduling, Two Rows (Arrangement), etc. which were doable.

- For the LR section, the primary focus was on Standalone questions, like Directions, Family Tree, etc. 5-6 questions were asked from Directions.
- Very easy questions were asked from Coding Decoding. One question was on Chinese Coding.
- The questions on Syllogisms were difficult.
- Fewer questions were found on Critical Reasoning.
- Many questions were asked from the Alphabetical Series.
- The questions asked by Quant required exhaustive calculations. Questions were based on direct calculations and their difficulty level ranged from moderate to difficult.
- 4-5 questions were asked from Number Series, and the rest of the questions were on Arithmetic, Simplification, HCF & LCM and Probability (2-3 questions on cards).
- The Quant section was heavily dominated by calculation-intensive Arithmetic.
- No Quadratic and Data Sufficiency questions were asked.
- Most of the questions in the Quant section were word problems.
- The following number of questions were asked from the following topics:

- Technical questions from Quant were less in number.
- 2 questions were asked from Permutation and Combination and 2 questions were from Probability.
- 1-2 questions were asked from Geometry and they were easy to answer.
- 1 question was asked from Mensuration.
- 2 RC passages were there in the question paper which were easy to understand but lengthy, thus requiring a lot of reading. A total of 12 questions were asked from them. The passages were based on Journalism and Educational System.
- Vocabulary questions were difficult. Other questions were from Fill in the Blanks, Idioms, Phrases, Synonyms & Antonyms.
- No questions were asked from Para Jumbles.
- The Abstract Reasoning section was easy. Questions were asked from Embedded, Pattern Completion, Water-Mirror Images, Series Completion, Cubes and Dices, etc. that were doable.

Overall Exam Analysis for March 9, 2024 (Shift 2)

- The overall difficulty level of the paper ranged from easy to moderate. However, the question paper was slightly difficult from the first slot.
- The question paper was completely sectional-type, which implies, that the number of questions in each section was as follows:

- No questions were asked from Data Interpretation in the Quant section. Questions were asked from Data Sufficiency (4-5 questions), Number Series, and Arithmetic.
- A significant number of questions were asked from Permutation & Combination, Probability, and Time, Speed & Distance.
- There was 1 Venn Diagram as well.
- In the LR section, 2 sets were there from Circular Arrangement, and other questions were asked from Scheduling, Syllogism, Coding-Decoding, Analogy, Alphabetical Series, Directions, etc. The Scheduling puzzle was difficult and based on people coming and going out of a restaurant.
- In the Abstract Reasoning section, questions were asked from Embedded, Pattern Completion, Water-Mirror Images, Series Completion, etc.
- There were 3 RCs in the VARC section: 1 on Australian Banking, 1 on Automobiles, and 1 on Middle Class People.

- From Grammar, questions were on Error Spotting. Other questions were from Fill in the Blanks and Vocabulary.
- 6-8 questions were asked from Critical Reasoning.

Overall Exam Analysis for March 10, 2024 (Shift 1)

The overall difficulty level of MAH MBA CET Day 2 slot 1 paper was tougher than that of Day 1 Morning Slot paper. Check out the section wise analysis in the table below:

- The logical reasoning comprised of a lot of miscellaneous questions including puzzles.
- There were several questions related to Blood relations.
- The overall paper was time-consuming especially for the reasoning portion of the question paper.
- The abstract reasoning portion of the question paper was doable with some tricky questions.
- There were four number system questions in the Quantitative Aptitude portion.
- The overall difficulty level of QA section was challenging for most students.

- Questions related to heights and distances, and probability were asked in the MAH MBA CET Day 2 morning slot question paper.
- There were also many questions related to Modern Maths.
- For the Verbal Ability/Reading Comprehension section there was a lack of grammar related questions and was dominated by RC and Vocabulary related questions.

Overall Exam Analysis for March 10, 2024 (Shift 2)

The overall difficulty level of MAH MBA CET Day 2 slot 2 paper was tougher than that of Day 2 Morning Slot paper. Check out the section wise analysis in the table below:

- According to many experts, the MAH MBA CET Day 2 Evening Slot question paper was copied from the XAT 2017/2021 paper.
- The MAH MBA CET Day 2 Evening Slot question paper was lengthy and many students considered this paper as the toughest MAH MBA CET 2024 slot yet.
- There was an abundance of Vocabulary questions in the Verbal ability portion of MAH MBA CET slot 4 question paper.
- As for the Logical Reasoning portion, there were a lot of Puzzles and the difficulty level of these puzzle questions was quite high. One of the puzzle questions was copied from CAT previous year question paper.
- For the Quantitative Aptitude section, there were no calculation based questions and nearly all the questions were conceptual.
- Some of the common topics asked in the QA section were Clocks and Calendars, Number System, Pie Charts, Bar Graphs, Geometry, Modern Maths.

- The Data Interpretation portion had a lot of calculation based questions.
- Both Abstract Reasoning and Critical Reasoning portions were moderately difficult.
- There were a total of 3 DI sets in the Logical Reasoning section. Some other topics in this section was Coding-Decoding, Analogies, Alphabetical series, directions.
- The VARC consisted of questions from Parajumbles, Cloze tests, poems, etc.

Overall Exam Analysis for March 11, 2024 (Shift 1)

The question paper was completely sectional-type. The overall difficulty level of Shift 1 was low. Check out the section-wise analysis for Shift 1 in the table below:

- Puzzles were lengthy but doable.
- DI sets were easy.
- In LR, questions were based on Arrangement, Profession, Circular, City-based, Scheduling, Alphabet-series, Coding, Blood Relations, Directions, Calendar, Alpha-Numeric, Syllogisms, etc.
- There were 5-6 puzzles in LR.
- The individual questions were very simple and did not require much effort while solving.
- Syllogism was a little complex and tricky.
- In AR, questions were based on Mirror Image, Water Image, Series, Odd One Out, Embedded, etc. A few questions were tricky and the rest were quite easy to answer.

- Quant was much easier compared to the exam conducted on March 10, 2024.
- In QA, maximum questions were asked from Investment Profit, Bar Graph, Arithmetic, HCF & LCM, Modern Maths, etc. These questions were also quite easy to answer.
- There were 3 Reading Comprehension passages that were easy and straightforward. 1 passage was based on a writer on a hill and the other one on Technology.
- In VARC, the other questions were based on Vocabulary, Error Detection, Phrase Replacement, Fill in the Blanks, Idioms, Synonyms & Antonyms, etc.

Overall Exam Analysis for March 11, 2024 (Shift 2)

- The difficulty level of this slot was extremely high.
- It was the most difficult of all the slots.
- The paper was quite lengthy.
- The questions were identical to the ones asked in the CAT exam.
- New types of questions from Syllogism were found.
